

Multiplier event by SOLUTION : Solidarité & Inclusion in Paris, France

SOLUTION organized the "Mend The Gap" multiplier event during the Erasmus Days, using the occasion to engage a wider audience, at the Espace Hermès, in the heart of Paris' 11th arrondissement. With an audience of 30 participants including educators, representatives of civil society organisations, particularly in the field of women's empowerment, and local council members, the event aimed to promote collaboration and showcase innovative educational resources developed through the project.

- **A project to promote inclusive education**



The Mend The Gap project was presented, highlighting its objectives, its expected results and its ambitions for the future of inclusive education in Europe. The presentation explained the rationale behind the project and outlined the resources developed to meet the needs of educators and trainers. Participants were invited to ask questions and share their experiences throughout the session, fostering an interactive and stimulating environment for all. The participants appreciated the user-friendliness and flexibility of the platform, which enables educators to adapt their learning path to their specific needs, an essential asset in supporting their training.

- **A flexible and attractive platform:**

A key part of the presentation was an overview of the project's online platform. Participants were able to explore the platform's various working modules and resources, with a particular focus on important tools such as a comprehensive toolkit for assessing educators' needs



and a specialised train-the-trainer programme. The procedure for creating accounts to access all the online resources was also explained, enabling all participants to become familiar with the project's digital environment and easily navigate its functionalities.



- **A renewed commitment to inclusive education**

The event concluded with an interactive session allowing everyone to share their thoughts. The effectiveness of the learner-centred needs assessment methodology was particularly appreciated, as was the project's ability to respond to the needs of vulnerable groups, reinforcing the relevance of the initiative.
